## Credit Retrieval Classes

Six week Credit Retrieval courses are designed for students who have already taken a particular course and not earned credit. A diagnostic assessment, given at the beginning of the course, helps indicate what standards the student still needs to meet. Upon successful completion of the individual Written Student Learning Plan (WSLP) for the course, the student earns a passing grade (C) and .5 credit in the given course.
