Diplomas!

Internet Academy does not offer diplomas. You are strongly encouraged to check with your local district to obtain graduation requirements. Washington State has the following minimum requirements for earning a diploma:

- High School and Beyond Plan
- Earn 19 credits (most districts exceed this)
- Pass WASL Reading and Writing if you are class of 2008-2009, and class 2013 and beyond must also pass Math and Science
- Culminating project

Credit Retrieval Classes

Credit retrieval courses are available for students who have already taken the class, but did not earn credit. IA offers three six-week credit retrieval sessions during the regular school year and one session during the summer. Students will be asked to provide a copy of their transcript for verification that the class was previously taken. Credit retrieval classes are tuition based. Upon successful completion of the course, students earn a passing grade (C), and .5 credit in the given course.
