In order for Internet Academy students to graduate in 4 years, students must take one class, where they will receive a 1.0 credit each semester. This class will require approximately 7.5 hours per week or 90 minutes each day of work, where all other classes will require 5 hours per week or 60 minutes each day to complete in a semester. **These time requirements are based on a full 90 day semester. If you start a class late, you will need to work more hours per week to complete the course by the end of the semester.**
