{ Course Description }

This standards-based course provides opportunities for students to analyze principles of human growth and development from conception to school age. Students analyze conditions that influence children in various ages and stages, including issues of nutrition, safety, guidance and discipline. Through a required four to six hour practicum experience, students learn and demonstrate age appropriate strategies with preschool to school age children. **Special Note: Students are required to participate in a four to six hour practicum/ internship during this course. Students cannot pass the class without successfully completing a minimum of four hours in a preschool or school age classroom at a licensed childcare/ preschool center or elementary school.

Course Materials:

At home practice of the principles and skills covered is encouraged. Recommendations for successful participation in this course include:

- Speakers to access the audio of the lessons and videos
- Headset with a microphone for our live study sessions.

Course Work

Course Work:

This course consists of lessons, discussions, text questions, research projects, a 4-6 hour internship and tests. All assessments are submitted as attachments through the course assignment pages. However, Mentor teachers will need to send graded internship rubrics to the course instructor be the last week of the course for the student to earn credit. All lesson content can be found within the course unit folders. There is a separate file in the unit folder for each assessment, project, quiz and test. Students can navigate using the tabs or breadcrumbs at the top of the Angel course page.

Internship/Practicum Requirements:

Students are required to participate in an early childhood classroom for a minimum of four hours and a maximum of six hours while taking this course. Babysitting hours do not qualify for this requirement. Students must work in a licensed daycare/ preschool or elementary school. Students are expected to locate and setup their own volunteer hours with the school of their choice. The course instructor will make contact with the school and Mentor Teacher to confirm placements. Mentor teachers, working with the IA students, are expected to fill out grading rubrics and return them directly to the course instructor for grading. Since this internship covers two of the course standards, students cannot meet standard/ pass the course without successfully completing the internship requirements.

Grading
